Last Spring the Association repaired and replaced the decking surrounding the community pool. The last time the pool had major repairs was almost 20 years ago. In Spring 2020 we will complete the updating of the community's "biggest asset." We will be replacing areas in the pool which have become separated from the gunnite foundation of the pool. We will be replacing the tiles at the waterline many of which are broken, cracked or missing. After the repairs are complete the entire pool will be resurfaced with a fresh coat of white Marsite. When finished, the pool will be something we can all be proud of. Weather permitting, all the repairs will be completed by Memorial Day 2020.

New Book: "The Face of WNY's Weather"

The Face of WNY's Weather




Stephen Vermette, PhD

Stephen Vermette, a long-time resident of Craneridge, has written a book on WNY's weather, after having taught the subject for 25+ years at SUNY Buffalo State. The book covers a variety of weather-related topics – basic weather concepts, our rollercoaster weather, severe weather, the business of reporting and forecasting weather, WNY's observational and forecasting history, and local climate trends. The book explains and documents WNY's weather, rich with local examples.

Included in the book are writeups (local knowledge contributors) from a number of weather enthusiasts, broadcast meteorologists, and retired National Weather Service (NWS) staff, as well as information tidbits such as the time it rained fish, how to use a rhododendron as a thermometer, and school-related snow day rituals. A chapter is dedicated to the history of the Buffalo Weather Office, as researched by the author from primary sources dating back to 1870, and additional histories going back to 1812. It is a book that you won't only read once; you will keep it as a reference to look through again and again.

Dr. Stephen Vermette has written by far the most complete compendium on WNY weather I have ever seen, also including vital basics on meteorology. Vermette is a Buffalo State professor who takes a multi-disciplinary approach to both our climatology and meteorology. He is an award-winning scientist who writes very well for the layperson. I highly recommend it - perfect gift for the WeatherGeek in your family!"

New Book: "WETSUIT"

A resident of Craneridge, Kim Chinquee's WETSUIT was published in March 2019.

Per James Thomas (editor of Flash Fiction, Sudden Fiction, Flash Fiction International), This book is brilliant, every bit of it. One delight after another. Chinquee makes the English language sing--amazing sentences, beautiful lines, incredible strokes. Dazzling.

Joseph Young says: "Like any book, Kim Chinquee's Wetsuit asks you to learn how to read it. For me, it's in the cascade, the ripples that accumulate against the shore or against a body as it floats. It's a sensory experience, one that asks me, at least, to feel as the sentences and words, the one story and then the next, accumulate in the body's memory. I don't ask the stories so much to make sense as to make corporal.

There's an intuition in how Chinquee constructs her stories, letting sentences and scenes associate as they might, often in small surprises. Of course, that doesn't mean there isn't craft in what she does--because there's a lot. As you read the book, or any of her books, you trust the years she's spent developing her idiom, you can feel and know it.

Wetsuit cycles through hope and anger and fear, disgust and ennui, boredom, tenderness, and it takes up a rhythm as you read through it. I might almost say it becomes meditative, except she's always popping in with those surprises, in language, character, or observation. "

Kim Chinquee serves as a Board Member of the Association of Writers and Writing Programs, representing as Northeast Regional Chair. She's a professor of English at SUNY-Buffalo State, and has over 500 pieces published in literary journals. She grew up on a dairy farm in Wisconsin, served in medical field in the Air Force, is a runner and triathlete. WETSUIT is her sixth book. We are more than happy to work with each homeowner to resolve any concerns that might exist. All homeowners are welcome to attend a meeting to coordinate with us for the approval of their project. In the rare event of a rejection, a homeowner can appeal to the Board of Directors for a reversal of our decision. This has only happened once in the last three years, and we work hard to avoid such an event.
